Located on 50 beautiful acres of Sutton land, **Mother Earth's Farm** was founded to provide environmental education and farming opportunities for all ages. This evolving farm will work in partnership with others focusing on farming and environmental education: Tufts University's New Entry Sustainable Farming Project (NESFP), an agriculture, food and environment program and In This Place Wilderness Workshops, designed to provide for a rich experience of the woods and land through hands-on skill training.

**Mother Earth's Farm** will begin farming with NESFP on a small parcel of the property in the spring of 2004. Wilderness workshops will be offered in the Summer and Fall of 2004. **Call us about programs to be started soon.**

#### New Entry Sustainable Farming Project (NESFP)

This non-profit, multi-disciplinary project was founded to help agriculturally experienced immigrants establish themselves as commercial farmers in New England. **Mother Earth's Farm** is developing a partnership with Tufts University to provide farm land in support of this fascinating niche of immigrant farming.\*

**Mother Earth's Farm** recognizes the potential to sustain the agricultural landscape in Sutton while supporting the goals of NESFP:

- To provide opportunities for immigrant farmers with limited resources
- To help these new growers produce and market fresh vegetables and other foods in demand by regional consumers
- To preserve local farmland, promote agriculture and familiarize consumers with ethnic produce.

### In This Place Wilderness Workshops

Specializing in wilderness workshops designed to teach skills to move confidently and rest easy in the woods, In this Place offers fun, challenging workshops for pre-teens through adult. The director, Paul Wanta, is an official tracker of 16 years, affiliate of New Mexico's The Tracking Project and Hawkeye Training Camp, and tracker and naturalist at The Farm School in Athol, MA. A practitioner of the Japanese martial art of Akido, Paul is currently a visiting instructor at the Chicken Coop Middle School in Athol, MA.

**Mother Earth's Farm** plans to offer In This Place workshops where participants will learn about tracking, fire making, shelter building and other skills designed to help them become trackers and woods people. They will eat food cooked over an open fire, sleep in their own hand-built shelter, practice exercises to hone the senses, play games, sit around the fire, tell stories, laugh, sing songs, and much more.
